Composer/arranger, bandleader, and former trombonist **Brent Wallarab** is David N. Baker Professor in Jazz Studies and associate professor of music in jazz studies at the IU Jacobs School of Music, where he conducts Jazz Ensemble I and teaches courses in jazz arranging, composition, and jazz history. Before his appointment at the Jacobs School, he maintained a diverse freelance career writing for or performing with artists including

the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra, Benny Carter, Count Basie Orchestra, Rosemary Clooney, New York Pops Orchestra, Natalie Cole, Ray Charles, Perry Como, and Bobby Short. A founding member of the Smithsonian Jazz Masterworks Orchestra, Wallarab served as lead trombonist and principal arranger from 1991 through 2008 and was appointed specialist in jazz for the Smithsonian Institution in 1993. In 1994, he cofounded the Indianapolis-based Buselli-Wallarab Jazz Orchestra (BWJO), which has given over 1,000 live performances. The BWJO has recorded eight CDs, and its 2008 release, Basically Baker, was named one of the top 100 jazz albums of the decade by DownBeat magazine. Wallarab has had an active national and international career, including performances in Canada, Italy, France, Finland, the Netherlands, England, Spain, Turkey, Egypt, South Africa, and all 50 U.S. states. He has arrangements published through Warner Bros., Kendor, and Really Good Music.



David Brent Johnson began his radio career at Bloomington community radio station WFHB, where he hosted the weekly jazz program *All That Jazz*. He started working as a part-time substitute host for WFIU's *Just You And Me* in 2002 and in 2004 created WFIU's weekly jazz history show *Night Lights*, which is now nationally syndicated. He has also produced several jazz documentaries for WFIU, including *Bix Beiderbecke*:

Never the Same Way Twice, "Jump for Joy": Duke Ellington's Celebratory Musical, and a fourpart history of jazz in Indiana. An Indianapolis native and IU alumnus, Johnson feels a keen connection to the history and current state of Indiana jazz. A writer who has published frequently in local and regional publicatins, including Bloom Magazine, The Ryder, the Bloomington Independent, and Indianapolis Nuvo, he has won two Society of Professional Journalists awards for his arts writing and has also written for DownBeat Magazine and NPR's A Blog Supreme. He is also the 2012 recipient of the Al Cobine Award, given by Jazz From Bloomington for outstanding service to the south-central Indiana jazz community. He lives in Bloomington's Near Westside neighborhood, a short walk from the gravesite of Hoagy Carmichael.


