Internationally renowned bassist and Origin Records recording artist **Rodney Whitaker** is professor of jazz bass and director of Jazz Studies at Michigan State University, where he has built one of the leading jazz degree programs and performing faculty in the world. He is considered one of the leading performers and teachers of the jazz double bass in the United States. He is

also artistic director of the Michigan State University Professors of Jazz, former artistic advisor of Jazz @ Wharton Center, director of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's Civic Jazz Orchestra, and a former member of the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra. Whitaker has earned an international reputation as one of the world's finest jazz double bass performers. He completed a seven-year tenure as bassist with Wynton Marsalis's Septet and the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra. He has toured the world over the last 25 years, collaborating and performing with legendary jazz artists such as Dianne Reeves, Cassandra Wilson, Diana Krall, Terence Blanchard, Regina Carter, and Betty "Bebop" Carter, as well as performing with leading symphony orchestras worldwide. Whitaker has recorded with great musicians such as Roy Hargrove, Pat Metheny, and Wynton Marsalis and is featured on more than 100 recordings. In 2011, he was nominated for an Emmy Award in the Original Music category for Malawi and Malaria: Fighting to Save the Children, produced by Robert Gould and Sue Carter. Whitaker has presented numerous master classes across the nation and is a consultant with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in the development of its jazz education department. He has served on the faculties of the University of Michigan and the Julliard Institute of Jazz. In 2006, he was nominated for a Juno Award, Canada's equivalent to the Grammy, for his work on Let Me Tell You About My Day, produced by Alma Records. He collaborated with musicians Phil Dwyer and Alan Jones on the album, which was nominated for Traditional Jazz Album of the Year.



Tom Walsh is Robert J. Waller Sr. and Robert J. Waller Jr. Professor of Music (saxophone) and chair of the Jazz Studies Department at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. An active performer of jazz and classical music, he has presented concerts and workshops in South Africa, China, Brazil, Japan, Azerbaijan, Costa Rica, in Europe, and across the United States.

He is the co-author of the fifth edition of *Creative Jazz Improvisation* (2022) with Scott Reeves. His beginning improvisation book *Jazz Master Teaches You to Improvise* was published by Shanghai Music Publishing House in 2019. Recent recordings include *The Pandemic Sessions* by the IU jazz faculty, Luke Gillespie's *Moving Mists, Basically Baker, Vol. 2*, with the Buselli-Wallarab Jazz Orchestra (Patois), and Mike Hackett's *New Point of View* (Summit). Premiere performances include Scott Jones's concert band arrangement of Russell Peck's *The Upward Stream*, Chris Rutkowski's Concerto for Alto Saxophone and Wind Ensemble, and David Baker's Concerto for Alto Saxophone and Orchestra. His latest solo CD release is *Intersections* (Arizona University Recordings). Earlier solo CDs

include New Life (RIAX) and Shaking the Pumpkin (RIAX). Other releases include the David Baker Concerto on Paul Freeman Introduces David Baker, Vol. XII (Albany), Basically Baker with the Buselli/Wallarab Jazz Orchestra (Patois), and Sky Scrapings: Saxophone Music of Don Freund (AUR). Walsh is a Yamaha Performing Artist and a Vandoren Artist. He taught at the Jamey Aebersold Summer Jazz Workshops 1991-2019. He co-leads the IU Summer Saxophone Academy with Otis Murphy and is co-director of the College Audition Preparation Workshop. Walsh earned degrees in Saxophone Performance and Jazz Studies from Indiana University, where his principal teachers were distinguished classical saxophonist Eugene Rousseau and renowned jazz educator David Baker. His other influential teachers include Mike Tracy, Pat LaBarbera, Jerry Coker, and David Liebman.



David Brent Johnson began his radio career at Bloomington community radio station WFHB, where he hosted the weekly jazz program *All That Jazz*. He started working as a part-time substitute host for WFIU's *Just You And Me* in 2002 and in 2004 created WFIU's weekly jazz history show *Night Lights*, which is now nationally syndicated. He has also produced

several jazz documentaries for WFIU, including *Bix Beiderbecke: Never the Same Way Twice*, "Jump for Joy": Duke Ellington's Celebratory Musical, and a four-part history of jazz in Indiana. An Indianapolis native and IU alumnus, Johnson feels a keen connection to the history and current state of Indiana jazz. A writer who has published frequently in local and regional publicatins, including *Bloom Magazine*, The Ryder, the Bloomington Independent, and Indianapolis Nuvo, he has won two Society of Professional Journalists awards for his arts writing and has also written for DownBeat Magazine and NPR's A Blog Supreme. He is also the 2012 recipient of the Al Cobine Award, given by Jazz From Bloomington for outstanding service to the south-central Indiana jazz community. He lives in Bloomington's Near Westside neighborhood, a short walk from the gravesite of Hoagy Carmichael.
